First Year Students

First year students are eligible for all work opportunities. First year students are only eligible for externships (for academic credit) after the completion of their first year of law school. We encourage employers to keep contact with first-year students to a minimum in the first (fall) semester of law school to allow first-year students to settle in and be successful with their academics. We do not, however, prohibit contact with first-year students or any students before a certain date. We post job notices at any time during the traditional school year and into the summer
